**H**appy New Year to everyone. The nights are getting noticeably lighter and thoughts are turning towards the new season. Now is the time to check that vaccinations are up to date and that your insurance cover is adequate.

The BHDTA insurance policy, which covers events run by affiliated clubs such as ourselves, now also covers members **on the day of an event** for legal liability. This means that a day membership will be payable if you are not a full SCDA member so that the cover is effective.

The SCDA had an interesting and well attended conference in November and the main points discussed are in this newsletter. The SCDA stand and display at the Equine Fair in December were very successful and the preparations for the World Championships for Disabled Drivers at Hopetoun are making progress, but more of that later.

Our web-site continues to go from strength to strength. In 2001 we had 7,734 visitors, in 2002 this was 12,285 and last year in 2003 this more than doubled to a massive **27,105!** Obviously more than just our own members find the site useful. ### **2004 Memberships**

It is that time of year again! A 2004 membership form is enclosed with this newsletter. As usual, everyone paying their subscription before the AGM will be able to collect their Omnibus Schedule on the day. This is the last newsletter you will receive if you do not renew your membership for 2004.

You will notice a number of changes to the membership categories and these are explained below. The directors had considered that there were too many different categories of membership and proposed a number of changes to rationalise these, which the members at the conference all agreed with. A full driving member will still cost £20 but an associate member has been reduced to £10. Juniors will pay £14 but if they are already members of Junior Chariots they will pay a reduced membership of £7. A reciprocal arrangement exists if a junior SCDA member wishes to join Junior Chariots.

## SCDA Omnibus Schedule 2004

If you are unable to attend the AGM, the Omnibus will be sent to you with the next newsletter.

There is a new event entry form this year. The entry fee has unfortunately had to be increased to cover the huge rise in insurance premiums, which has been passed on to the clubs by the BHDTA, as we sadly live in an ever more litigious society. This means that the competitors will have to bear the cost of the increase since they are the ones benefiting from the insurance cover. As I mentioned earlier, members benefit from the BHDTA insurance at all events organised by the SCDA. This removes the need for event organisers to check each member competitor's legal liability insurance cover, which has never been an easy task. The BHDTA advise that grooms will also need to be members if they are to benefit from the insurance cover, but can join at the Associate rate.

Each Scottish Points event will pay a levy to the SCDA on entry fees (other than juniors) which will be used to meet the increased insurance costs. This levy will not apply to grass roots events.

## BHDTA Council Elections

This year Scotland has an excellent opportunity to have two representatives on the BHDTA council. Ian Gilbert and Amanda Saville have both agreed to stand for election. If you are a member of the BHDTA, please make sure you vote for Ian and Amanda, and get Scotland's voice strengthened at national level.

We would like to thank Anneke Wallace for representing Scottish interests at council for the last six years. This is a long time to make the journey up and down to meetings and her contribution is very much appreciated.

## Course Builders' Conference

George Prince has very kindly agreed to come and give Scottish competitors and course builders the benefit of his experience on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> March 2004. This will take place at Oatridge and the cost of the whole day will be £10, which will include lunch and tea, coffee and biscuits in the morning and afternoon. ## Equine Passports

Recent information from DEFRA has slightly shifted the goalposts as far as obtaining a passport for your horse is concerned. The new ruling, taking effect from 1<sup>st</sup> February, is that a vet or other authorised person must complete the silhouette of the animal. At present, many passport issuing authorities accept drawings done by the owner. This will significantly increase the cost of obtaining a passport for some people. The deadline for getting an equine passport has now been extended to 30<sup>th</sup> June 2004.

## Training and Assessment Days

A number of venues have been organised to hopefully be accessible to every area in Scotland. The idea of these days is to provide an opportunity for newcomers to fulfil the basic criteria, specified by the SCDA in the Omnibus, for entry into a grass roots or Scottish Points event. In addition, there will be experienced help on hand to explain the competition format and some of the more confusing rules. You will be welcome to attend even if you do not have a turnout. ## Young Drivers' Clinics

Some of the foreign entries to this event require to borrow horses/ponies. We are looking for a pool of experienced horses and ponies who will be fit to compete in May 2004 and who's owners would consider lending them out. These animals must have competed at horse driving trials, be of an obedient and dependable temperament and be happy to be driven safely by anybody. As we do not know what disability the driver may have, they must not be too strong to hold but must be able to go forward and drive a decent dressage and a competitive marathon.

There is a well documented procedure for the lending out of these ponies/horses with vetting before and after the event and a steward in charge of overseeing their welfare throughout.

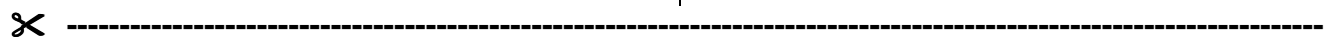

## Minutes of the Seventh Annual General Meeting

Oatridge College Broxburn, on Saturday 22nd February 2003

### **Welcome**

Ewan MacInnes welcomed members to the seventh Annual General Meeting.

### **Apologies:**

Apologies were received from Campbell & Elinor Bosanquet, Faith Szczuka, Mary & Vic Kusun, Pat & John White, Andrew Mylius, Alison Tuke, Bill Bryson, Viv Rome, Ann & Hamish Reid, James Lockhart, Susan Gardner, Mary Gardner.

### **Minutes of sixth Annual General Meeting**

The Minutes were taken as read and approved by the meeting. Proposed by Liz Melville and seconded by Catriona Murray.

There were no matters arising.

### **Chairman's remarks & report**

The chairman drew attention to the 2003 Omnibus which was now available to paid up members. He expressed his thanks to Hew Blair-Imrie for the huge amount of work he had put into the production of the Omnibus. He also thanked Owen Pilling for his generous donation of the front covers.

Ewan thanked all those people, members, helpers and friends for all their efforts in making 2002 a successful year. He drew members attention to his formal report contained in the Association's annual accounts.

He reminded members that he was stepping down as chairman at this meeting and handing over to Andrew Smith.

He briefly reviewed the events held in 2002. He noted that the numbers attending events was slightly down. While this may be an after effect of the FMD year he suggested that we must monitor the situation during 2003 as there was a possibility that there are too many events resulting in support becoming thinly spread.

Ewan recalled that his driving career had started after attending a driving event back in 1975. That first experience of carriage driving had been followed by many events, attended and organised, many beautiful places visited and many friends made.

He believed that he was handing to Andrew an association which is in good heart. He recalled that he was always happy to be a Director as it allowed him to put something back into the sport. He suggested that with others doing the same the sport will go forward.

On completion of the chairman's comments Andrew made a presentation to Ewan in recognition of his years as chairman.

### **Treasurers Report**

George Jeffrey presented the Association's Annual Accounts for the year to 30 September 2002. He noted a loss of £2190. He explained that the accounts were distorted as with Hopetoun not running in the 2002, sponsorship, included in the 2002 accounts had in effect been carried forward and spent in 2003. He suggested that combining the results for 2002 and 2003 gave a fairer view of the Associations position.

This still showed that the Association was eating into its reserves, a situation which must be reversed in the current year.

The accounts were approved by the meeting.

### **Confirmation of office bearers**

The following positions were confirmed by the meeting:

Andrew Smith took over the chair from Ewan MacInnes and thanked Ewan for all his work as Chairman. He noted that Ewan would remain a Director.

### **Board of Directors**

Ian Gilbert and Ian Bertram were due to retire by rotation and were available for re-election. Their election was confirmed by the meeting

Viv Rome had indicated her intention to retire as a Director. Andrew thanked her for her work as a director and contribution to the sport.

Nominations for new directors had been received for Amanda Saville, Catriona Murray and Ian Thornton-Kemsley. Their election as Directors was confirmed by the meeting.

### **Rule Changes**

In the absence of Anneke Wallace, who was unwell, Diana Brownlie gave a resume of the rule changes. Viz. track widths now universally 138cm for cones and 125cm for marathon, and only disabled drivers can now use ATV's in obstacles (their grooms must walk within obstacles).

### **Presentations**

Andrew explained that the Directors had created two new awards in memory of two outstanding members who had both contributed greatly to the sport and to our Association.

The first presentation of these awards were made to:

John Endicott - the new Archie Donald Award in recognition of John's sterling work as stable manager at both at Hopetoun & Castle Kennedy.

Faith Szczuka – The new Graham Murray Trophy for best Scottish Competitor in a selected class (This year – tandem ) at Scottish Nationals.

In addition a presentation was made to Jeff & Chris Atkins in recognition of their many years as Steward's organisers.

Finally a cheque was presented to Ali Maynard who was one of the three winners of the new Scotia Prize. Andrew announced that for 2003 Bellcrown Carriages were generously sponsoring the Scotia prizes.

### **AOCB**

Hopetoun - The committee has been increased to ten members.

The new dressage arena will be used this year. Volunteers were sought for a stone pick up exercise on 5 April

The event may have some international competitors this year.

Owen Pilling Graphics have once again agreed to be the event's main sponsor.

Steward's organisers will be Pat White and Zoë Sanders.

The Event now has its own Web Site.

Representation on BHDTA council - Anneke Wallace has indicated her intention to resign from the BHDTA council next year. Andrew asked for thought to be given to a successor.

Stewards Training - Training will take place at the Eglinton Event On The Saturday , and at Oatridge / Dalmeny.

Course Builders training - A local need was identified and quickly addressed by training to be organised by Ian Gilbert and Ian Bertram at Hopetoun on 12 April
