### **Bidwells Ridden Clydesdale Series:**

To be judged as a ridden hunter class. This class is a qualifier for the Bidwells Ridden Clydesdale Championship to be held at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials in August 2019. The first two in each class to qualify. Qualification may go down to fourth place, if horses placed 1st and 2nd have previously qualified. Registered Clydesdales and those eligible for registration may qualify and enter for the Championship.

### **Osborne Refrigerators Qualifiers**

The classes are a qualifier for the 2019 Osborne Refrigerators BDS National Championships in September 2019. The highest placed turnout owned and driven by a member of the British Driving Society and eligible for the following Type - Section/s disregarding those already qualified down to 6th place in the class will qualify for the 2019 Semi-Finals.

The Championship will immediately follow the Semi-Finals Type-Section/s

- a – single hackney-type – over 13.2hh (Class 14)
- b – single hackney-type – 13.2hh & under (Class 14)
- e - Country turnout - single, pair or tandem (Class 14)
- h -Single Registered Mountain & Moorland (excluding purebred Registered Welsh) (Class 14)
- i -Pairs & Tandems - Open. Any height (Class 15)
- j – Two Wheel Light Trade
- k – Four Wheel Light Trade
- l -Single or Tandem Turnout driven to a two-wheel exercise vehicle (Class 6)

### **Private Driving**

Horse or pony, 4 years old or over, driven to a traditional or traditional type vehicle. A traditional vehicle means a vehicle of traditional profile and identifiable type to resemble the design of a carriage built prior to the First World War. The vehicle may be made from modern materials but must have traditional style springing and carriage lamps. Pneumatic tyred vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible.

This class may be split by height - 13.2hh & Under and Over 13.2hh

Private Driving classes can be sub-divided into separate classes, if required. The most popular classes include:-

1. Breed Specific - e.g. Registered Welsh, Mountain & Moorland, World & Rare Breeds
2. Number of Horses/Ponies in each turnout - e.g. Singles, Pairs/Tandems, Multiples
3. Novice (Definition of a Novice Horse or Pony is an animal which has not won a First Prize or a First Prize Rosette, in a driving class, prior to 1st January in the year of the Show)
4. Vehicle specific - e.g. Country Vehicle

### **Exercise Vehicles**

1. Open to horses & ponies, 4 years old or over. A single, pair or tandem driven to a carriage of non-traditional type design and includes those with pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (i.e. not car tyres). Lamps need not be carried. Judging will include general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability.
2. This class may be split into two wheel & four wheel exercise vehicles.
3. Donkey/mules can be accepted if a show wishes.

### **Concours D'elegance**

1. Open to singles, pairs, multiples, 4 years old or over, to a traditional type vehicle.
2. The essence of the class is the word 'elegance' and the winner will be the turnout, which, in the opinion of the Judge, presents the most elegant effect.
3. To include vehicle, horse, driver, passenger etc. but above all the general impression.
4. Attention may be paid to driver's/passengers' personal costume but fancy dress or period costume is definitely barred.
5. The whole object of the class is to establish which turnout presents the most pleasing picture and normal judging criteria does not apply.
6. It is judged from a distance and vehicles are NOT closely inspected. To be driven at park pace.

### **Young Driver**

1. Open to drivers aged 17 & under on show date driving traditional/traditional-type vehicles or an exercise vehicle fitted with traditional/traditional type wheels.
2. Lamps need not be carried. This class is judged to determine the capabilities of the driver, and particular attention will be paid to the dress, turnout and driving procedure.
3. A competent, experienced adult groom aged 18 years or over to be carried at all times.
4. This class can be split by age group e.g. 10-14 years, 15-17 years
5. Young Drivers must wear a hard hat at all times on the carriage

SCDA2	<b>Accumulator Cones</b> Each competitor has 2 minutes to accumulate as many points as possible. Highest score wins

## Main Arena (From 10am)

1	<b>Potential Driving Horse / Pony</b> To be shown in hand - for horses or ponies that have not yet started any driving career
2 & 4	<b>Ride and Drive</b> Competitors will be judged as per a private driving class. In the event of a tie, the highest placed driving exhibit will be deemed the winner. Judge will not ride this class. Drive section will take place after Class 3
3	<b>Long Reining Class</b> Each competitor will give a 2 minute display including walk and trot paces, a rein back, circle, figure of 8 and negotiate a line of cones. Open to single horse or pony in a full set of harness.
5	<b>Novice Driving Pony / Horse</b> Not to have been placed 1st to 3rd in any driving class - subject to enough entries
6	<b>Exercise Vehicles</b> Open to singles or multiples and will be split 2 & 4 wheel vehicles if sufficient numbers forward
7	<b>Ridden Clydesdale / Heavy Horse</b> Blair Qualifier – Clydesdale only. Judge will ride this class.
8	<b>Junior Driver</b>
9	<b>Donkey Driving</b> Open to singles or multiples – to be judged as a Private Driving Class

## Main Arena (From 2:15pm)

11	<b>Clydesdale / Heavy Horse Ladies Cart</b> Open to single heavy horse driven to a ladies cart
12	<b>Concours d'Elegance</b> Open to ANY turnout. The winning turnout will be in the opinion of the judge that which presents the most elegant effect. Normal judging criteria does not apply and is judged at a distance with no close inspection of harness or vehicles
13	<b>Heavy Horses - Pairs</b> Pairs driven to a traditional wagon or cart
14	<b>Private Driving</b> This class will be split to 13.2hh and under and over 13.2hh if sufficient numbers forward
15	<b>Heavy Horses - Teams or Unicorns</b> Open to Heavy Horses in teams or unicorn driven to a traditional wagon or cart
16	<b>Multiples - Light Horses</b> Open to singles or multiples and will be split 2 & 4 wheel vehicles if sufficient numbers forward

## Rules

1. Horses/ponies must be four years old or over, except classes 1, 3, 11, 13 and 15
2. Competitors entering in more than one section accept the risk that timing may prohibit them from competing.
3. Any animal not under control of handler / driver MUST if asked by Judge or Steward to leave the ring,
4. No protests will be received unless lodged in writing giving particulars to the Secretary within 2 hours of rosettes being awarded, along with a deposit of £50-00 for each protest, which shall be forfeited if the objection is over-ruled. The Committee shall have full power to settle all disputes, questions, differences and claims arising at or in connection with the Show and their decision shall be final and binding on all parties. The Area Commissioner, failing whom the Assistant AC, shall have power to convene at any time an emergency Meeting on the Showground to dispose of any matter that he may consider urgent.
5. No person shall be allowed to bring stock on to the ground that has had any notifiable disease in their animals within a period of three months prior to the day of the Show.
6. No person shall be allowed within the ring while the Judges are making their awards – other than Stewards and Assistant Stewards. No persons shall in any way interfere with, or obstruct any Judge, Steward or Assistant Steward of the Show while in the execution of their duty.
7. The organisers will not be liable in respect of any claim for loss, injury or damage which any stock, article or person may sustain from accident or otherwise at or in connection with the Show

## Insurance

All exhibitors' turnouts and horses must carry suitable public liability insurance. Entrants are required to provide membership numbers for BDS, BHS or SCDA on entry form. Entrants who are not members of any of these bodies must show a copy of their valid public liability insurance to the secretary on the day
